## Guidelines on GlosCAN blog posts and comment threads

Proposed blog posts should be sent to info[at]gloscan.org. The content will then be sent to all Steering Group members. At least two Steering Group members will review the content and either recommend acceptance or work with its author to arrive at a version they are content with. The version passed by the reviewers will then be sent to the other Steering Group members, and unless any objects within seven days, the blog post will be uploaded onto the web-site.

Comments should be submitted on-line. They will be checked by the moderator and uploaded unless deemed unsuitable (for example, anonymous or potentially offensive).

Guidelines for a blog post are as follows:

- It must be submitted by a registered GlosCAN Supporter.
- It must be directly relevant to climate change.
- It must be consistent with GlosCAN's Starting Points and Aims (http://gloscan.org/about/, which any registered Supporter will have signed up to).
- It should be as concise as possible, not exceeding 1,000 words.
- It should be given a brief title that will encourage visitors to the blogging area to read it.
- A secondary longer title may be placed at the top of the blog post itself.
- The text should be understandable without the use of complex formatting, which may not survive when uploaded. If in doubt, please liaise with info[at]gloscan.org.
- Photographs and other images are welcome.
- Diverse literary forms are welcome (for example, poems as well as prose).
- References are optional, but the author must be able to substantiate any claims and assertions made.
- Links to other web-sites or documents may be provided. These may include links to documents provided by the author as pdf files.
